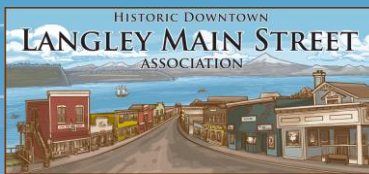

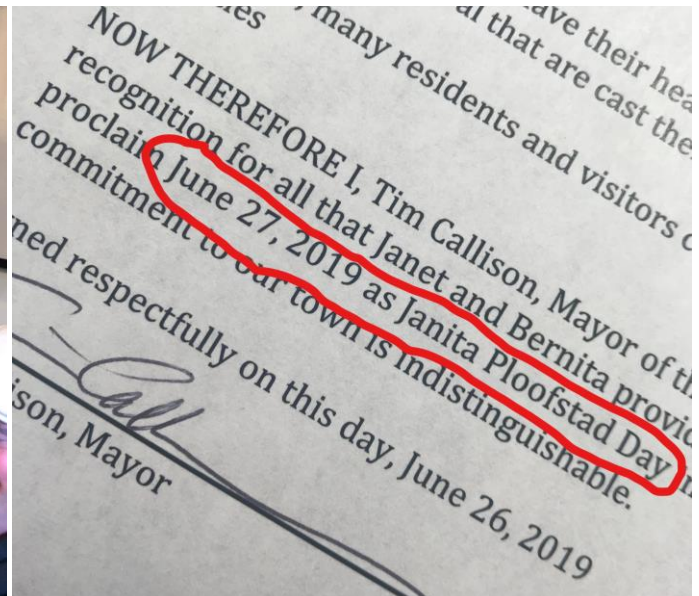
Frick Lane Improvements Almost Complete!

The Langley Main Street Association has been working on improvements to Frick Lane. It all started with the Frick Lane History Walk that includes five panels explaining with photos and text the early heritage of Langley, and improved lighting. From there, we started working on the other end of Frick Lane with the rehabilitation of planters and walls. These improvements also included new built-in wall seating. And we are now in the final stages of renovation of this major pedestrian walk-way with patching and sealing of the asphalt along with the addition of planters and such to entice strolling down the alleyway.
